In the identified area, the current year population is 4,735,593. In 2000, the Census count in the area was 4,447,100. The rate of change since 2000 was 0.62 percent annually. The five-year projection for the population in the area is 4,877,925, representing a change of 0.59 percent annually from 2010 to 2015. Currently, the population is 48.6 percent male and 51.4 percent female.

Population by Employment

Currently, 88.0 percent of the civilian labor force in the identified area is employed and 12.0 percent are unemployed. In comparison, 89.2 percent of the U.S. civilian labor force is employed, and 10.8 percent are unemployed. In five years the rate of employment in the area will be 90.5 percent of the civilian labor force, and unemployment will be 9.5 percent. The percentage of the U.S. civilian labor force that will be employed in five years is 91.2 percent, and 8.8 percent will be unemployed. In 2000, 59.7 percent of the population aged 16 years or older in the area participated in the labor force, and 0.4 percent were in the Armed Forces.

In the current year, the occupational distribution of the employed population is:

- 57.5 percent in white collar jobs (compared to 61.6 percent of the U.S. employment)
- 16.1 percent in service jobs (compared to 17.3 percent of U.S. employment)
- 26.4 percent in blue collar jobs (compared to 21.1 percent of U.S. employment)

In 2000, 83.0 percent of the area population drove alone to work, and 2.1 percent worked at home. The average travel time to work in 2000 was 24.8 minutes in the area, compared to the U.S average of 25.5 minutes.

Population by Education

In the current year, the educational attainment of the population aged 25 years or older in the area was distributed as follows:

- 17.9 percent had not earned a high school diploma (14.8 percent in the U.S)
- 32.9 percent were high school graduates only (29.6 percent in the U.S.)
- 6.8 percent had completed an Associate degree (7.7 percent in the U.S.)
- 14.0 percent had a Bachelor's degree (17.7 percent in the U.S.)
- 7.9 percent had earned a Master's/Professional/Doctorate Degree (10.4 percent in the U.S.)

Households by Income

Current median household income is \$40,616 in the area, compared to \$54,442 for all U.S. households. Median household income is projected to be \$44,419 in five years. In 2000, median household income was \$34,182, compared to \$23,597 in 1990.

Current average household income is \$52,412 in this area, compared to \$70,173 for all U.S. households. Average household income is projected to be \$54,017 in five years. In 2000, average household income was \$45,923, compared to \$30,484 in 1990.

Current per capita income is \$21,150 in the area, compared to the U.S. per capita income of \$26,739. The per capita income is projected to be \$21,923 in five years. In 2000, the per capita income was \$18,189, compared to \$11,486 in 1990.

Currently, 61.4 percent of the 2,228,073 housing units in the area are owner occupied; 23.1 percent, renter occupied; and 15.5 are vacant. In 2000, there were 1,963,711 housing units - 64.1 percent owner occupied, 24.4. percent renter occupied, and 11.5 percent vacant. The rate of change in housing units since 2000 is 1.24 percent. Median home value in the area is \$107,730, compared to a median home value of \$157,913 for the U.S. In five years, median value is projected to change by 3.52 percent annually to \$128,087. From 2000 to the current year, median home value change by 3.37 percent annually.
